AFTER / AS SOON AS / BEFORE / WHEN / WHILE / UNTIL FIRST CONDITIONAL

- I'm starting a job in sales <u>after</u> I **finish** school.
- As soon as you hear any news, will you let me know?
- I must get to the bank **before** it **closes**.
- I'll need the car while I'm there.
- We'll finish the meal **before** you **leave**.
- o I think it'll be better **if** you **wait** until Friday.

FIRST CONDITIONAL

• The main clause often has *will*. But we can use other modal verbs:

If you haven't got a television, you *can't watch* the match.

If Henry jogs regularly, he *might lose* weight.

If Matthew wants to get that job, he **should wear** a tie to the interview.
